Drawing Butterflies and Moths Instructor: Mary Christiansen Materials List



Paper: Stonehenge Kraft Drawing Paper, one pad 9x12" A few sheets of drawing paper (any kind as long as it is fairly smooth) Tracing paper Transfer paper: Saral Transfer Paper White. Please do not buy any other brand.

Brushes: One or two small round synthetic brush #4—Silver brand is good, but there are many others.

A small white ceramic plate or saucer

Pencils:

1 or 2 HB wood graphite pencils (professional brands such as Faber Castel, Tombow, Staedtler Mars Lumograph, Derwent)

Pencil Sharpener: Muji brand is great

Erasers: Kneadable rubber eraser White plastic eraser

Paint:

One tube gouache in Titanium white or Permanent white: M. Graham, Holbein, Winsor and Newton, or Turner are good brands. Do NOT buy acrylic gouache. One tube (can be the small size: 5ml/ 1.7 oz) Daniel Smith Neutral Tint OR Paynes Grey watercolor.

Colored Pencils:

If you own any artists' quality colored pencils, bring them. If you are going to purchase, Faber-Castel is an excellent brand. Sets are available, but it is better to buy individual colors. Do not buy watercolor pencils.

*Here is a suggested range of colors:
Dark sepia 175
Ivory 103
Earth tones: burnt ochre 187, Venetian red 190, or burnt sienna 283
Black 199
White Prismacolor 938
A light gray (any shade will do)

The above are all the colors you will need to get started, but if you already own colored pencils and want to bring more colors to class that is fine. I will be bringing some additional colors that students can use to add touches of color to their drawings.

The above names and numbers refer to Faber-Castel pencils. Another brand such as Prismacolor, Caran d'Ache Luminance, or Derwent can be purchased, and they carry a similar range of colors. Make sure to buy artists' grade pencils, not student or school quality.

*** Please bring to the first class:

A small piece of Styrofoam at least 4x3". This will be for mounting your butterfly specimen. A small box to carry it in. I will provide the specimens.
